Flood Watch – Skeena River, Kispiox River (UPGRADED) - High Streamflow Advisory – Bulkley River (MAINTAINED), Nass River (ISSUED) Issued: 2:00 PM June 2, 2021

Recent heavy rain on a melting snowpack has increased flows considerably, especially in the Skeena River watershed, including the Kispiox River. Automated snow weather stations in the region measured 35-55mm of precipitation over the past 48 hours. The addition of heavy rain increased the rate of snowmelt significantly. At 4B16P Shedin Creek, 67mm of snow water equivalent melted yesterday (the most of any station in the province) and an additional 50mm has already melted today. The station 4B17P Tsai Creek melted 51mm of snow water equivalent yesterday.

The Skeena River at Usk is currently flowing at 4,900 m³/s (between 2 and 5-year flow) and forecast to potentially reach 20-year return period levels. The Kispiox River near Hazelton is flowing at 365 m³/s (nearing a 5-year flow) and forecast to potentially reach between 10 to 20-year flows. The Bulkley River near Smithers is flowing at 715 m³/s (between 1 and 2-year flow) and may reach a 2-year flow in the forecast period. The Nass River above Shumal Creek is flowing at 3,450 m³/s (2-year flow) and forecast to possibly reach 5-year return period levels.

The public is advised to stay clear of the fast-flowing rivers and potentially unstable riverbanks during the high-streamflow period.

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The <u>River Forecast Centre</u> continues to monitor the conditions and will provide updates as conditions warrant.

BC River Forecast Centre

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A *High Streamflow Advisory* means that river levels are rising or expected to rise rapidly, but that no major flooding is expected. Minor flooding in low-lying areas is possible.

A *Flood Watch* means that river levels are rising and will approach or may exceed bankfull. Flooding of areas adjacent to affected rivers may occur.

A *Flood Warning* means that river levels have exceeded bankfull or will exceed bankfull imminently, and that flooding of areas adjacent to the rivers affected will result.
