High Streamflow Advisory - San Jose River (DOWNGRADED)

The River Forecast Centre is **downgrading** to a **High Streamflow Advisory** for:

- **San Jose River**

The River Forecast Centre is **ending** the **High Streamflow Advisory and Flood Watch** for:

- **Nazko River**
- **Cariboo Region, including Baker Creek, Bridge Creek, West Road River and tributaries around Williams Lake, Quesnel and Prince George**

Cooler temperatures, diminishing snow melt and drier weather has been contributing to improving river conditions throughout the region. Flows across the region have been declining, however still remain elevated in some areas, including the San Jose River, Bridge Creek, Nazko River and Baker Creek. Relatively stable weather through the region into the week should continue to promote on-going improvements in flow conditions.

The public is advised to stay clear of the fast-flowing rivers and potentially unstable riverbanks during the high-streamflow period.

A **High Streamflow Advisory** means that river levels are rising or expected to rise rapidly, but that no major flooding is expected. Minor flooding in low-lying areas is possible.

A **Flood Watch** means that river levels are rising and will approach or may exceed bankfull. Flooding of areas adjacent to affected rivers may occur.

A **Flood Warning** means that river levels have exceeded bankfull or will exceed bankfull imminently, and that flooding of areas adjacent to the rivers affected will result.
