Maintained: High Streamflow Advisory – Liard River

The River Forecast Centre is **maintaining** the **High Streamflow Advisory** for:

- **Liard River and tributaries**

The Liard River is currently running at flows between the 2- and 5-year return periods. Based on the current hydrologic modeling, hot temperatures and snowmelt from higher elevations are expected to keep the river levels high over the weekend into next week. The public is advised to stay clear of the fast-flowing rivers and potentially unstable riverbanks during the high-streamflow period.

The [River Forecast Centre](#) continues to monitor the conditions and will provide updates as conditions warrant.

BC River Forecast Centre

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A **High Streamflow Advisory** means that river levels are rising or expected to rise rapidly, but that no major flooding is expected. Minor flooding in low-lying areas is possible.

A **Flood Watch** means that river levels are rising and will approach or may exceed bankfull. Flooding of areas adjacent to affected rivers may occur.

A **Flood Warning** means that river levels have exceeded bankfull or will exceed bankfull imminently, and that flooding of areas adjacent to the rivers affected will result.
