ENDED - High Streamflow Advisory – Skeena and Bulkley Rivers Issued: 11:45 AM July 2, 2021

The River Forecast Centre is ending a High Streamflow Advisory for:

- Skeena River and tributaries (including the Zymoetz, and Kitsumkalum Rivers)
- Bulkley River and tributaries (including the Telkwa River)

Extreme temperatures have eased through the region, resulting in decreased snow and glacier melt rates at high elevations. River levels have peaked and are now receding.

The public is advised to stay clear of the fast-flowing rivers and potentially unstable riverbanks during the high-streamflow period.

The <u>River Forecast Centre</u> continues to monitor the conditions and will provide updates as conditions warrant.

A *High Streamflow Advisory* means that river levels are rising or expected to rise rapidly, but that no major flooding is expected. Minor flooding in low-lying areas is possible.

A *Flood Watch* means that river levels are rising and will approach or may exceed bankfull. Flooding of areas adjacent to affected rivers may occur.

A **Flood Warning** means that river levels have exceeded bankfull or will exceed bankfull imminently, and that flooding of areas adjacent to the rivers affected will result.
