High Streamflow Advisory – Nechako River (DOWNGRADED)

ISSUED: 8:45 AM July 25, 2022

The River Forecast Centre is **downgrading** to a **High Streamflow Advisory** for:

- **Nechako River**

Flows reached the highest levels of the season last week on the Nechako River. Ongoing warm and dry weather stabilized flows within the Nechako region and rivers are now receding steadily. Continued dry conditions in the upcoming weather forecast will lead to ongoing lowering of water levels. Although rivers are on the downward trend, they remain very high for this time of year.

The public is advised to stay clear of the fast-flowing rivers and potentially unstable riverbanks during the high-streamflow period. [Be prepared and know your hazards.](#)

The [River Forecast Centre](#) continues to monitor the conditions and will provide updates as conditions warrant.

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A **High Streamflow Advisory** means that river levels are rising or expected to rise rapidly, but that no major flooding is expected. Minor flooding in low-lying areas is possible.

A **Flood Watch** means that river levels are rising and will approach or may exceed bankfull. Flooding of areas adjacent to affected rivers may occur.

A **Flood Warning** means that river levels have exceeded bankfull or will exceed bankfull imminently, and that flooding of areas adjacent to the rivers affected will result.
