## High Streamflow Advisory – North Coast

Issued: 10:15AM October 26, 2022

The River Forecast Centre is **issuing** a **High Streamflow Advisory** for:

- **North Coast**

A frontal system is expected to impact coastal British Columbia on Wednesday and Thursday. This is forecast to bring moderate to heavy rainfall across the North Coast. Environment and Climate Change Canada has issued Special Weather Statements and Rainfall Warnings indicating the potential for 24-hour precipitation totals in the 50 to 100 mm range for the region through Thursday morning.

Rivers are expected to rise on Wednesday through Thursday in response to rainfall. Hydrologic modelling is indicating the potential from flows around the 2-year return period level.

The public is advised to stay clear of the fast-flowing rivers and potentially unstable riverbanks during the high-streamflow period.

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A **High Streamflow Advisory** means that river levels are rising or expected to rise rapidly, but that no major flooding is expected. Minor flooding in low-lying areas is possible.

A **Flood Watch** means that river levels are rising and will approach or may exceed bankfull. Flooding of areas adjacent to affected rivers may occur.

A **Flood Warning** means that river levels have exceeded bankfull or will exceed bankfull imminently, and that flooding of areas adjacent to the rivers affected will result.
