Weather Synopsis:

The region experienced heavy rainfall over the past two days. Rainfall rates have now eased.

River Conditions:

Most rivers have now reached peak levels and are receding. In larger watersheds, and in areas with lake influence on rivers, streamflow remains high. This includes areas on Central Vancouver Island (including the Sproat and Somass Rivers), East Vancouver Island (including the Nanaimo River) and in the Sunshine Coast, Howe Sound and Sea-to-Sky corridor (including the Squamish River, Cheakamus River and surrounding areas). High flows are expected to persist through Thursday, with declining streamflow expected on Friday.

The continues to monitor the conditions and will provide updates as conditions warrant.

A *High Streamflow Advisory* means that river levels are rising or expected to rise rapidly, but that no major flooding is expected. Fast-flowing bodies of water increase risk to life safety. Minor flooding in low-lying areas is possible.

A *Flood Watch* means that river levels are rising and will approach or may exceed bankfull. Flooding of areas adjacent to affected rivers may occur.

A *Flood Warning* means that river levels have exceeded bankfull or will exceed bankfull imminently, and that flooding of areas adjacent to the rivers affected will result.
