High Streamflow Advisory – Vancouver Island, South Coast

The River Forecast Centre is issuing a High Streamflow Advisory for:

Western Vancouver Island including rivers around Tofino, Ucluelet, Port Renfrew and

surrounding areas

Southern Vancouver Island including rivers around Duncan, Chemainus and surrounding

areas

South Coast including Sunshine Coast, Howe Sound, Sea-to-Sky, North Shore Mountains,

Metro Vancouver, and Fraser Valley

Weather Synopsis:

An atmospheric river is approaching British Columbia bringing a period of wet weather from

Friday night through Sunday. Current weather forecasts indicate that West Vancouver Island

may expect 150 to 200 mm total precipitation for the event and South Coast Mountains may

expect 100 to 200 mm. The freezing levels will likely rise to 1500 m for the precipitation area.

Although confidence is high in the overall direction and characteristics of the storm, the exact

locations of heaviest precipitation are uncertain. The storm duration is expected to be about 24

to 36 hours, depending on the location.

River Conditions:

Runoff and streamflows will likely start to increase on Friday night, with flow responses

beginning on North Vancouver Island and proceeding south as the storm moves through the

region. Streamflow rises may be rapid. Significant flooding is not anticipated; however, localized

flooding (i.e., in smaller streams) and water pooling on roads are possible, particularly at lower

elevations and in areas with poor drainage.

Fast-flowing rivers pose increased risk to life safety, and the public is urged to be cautious.

The River Forecast Centre continues to monitor the conditions and will provide updates as

conditions warrant.

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A *High Streamflow Advisory* means that river levels are rising or expected to rise rapidly, but that no major flooding is expected. Fast-flowing bodies of water increase risk to life safety. Minor flooding in low-lying areas is possible.

A *Flood Watch* means that river levels are rising and will approach or may exceed bankfull. Flooding of areas adjacent to affected rivers may occur.

A *Flood Warning* means that river levels have exceeded bankfull or will exceed bankfull imminently, and that flooding of areas adjacent to the rivers affected will result.
